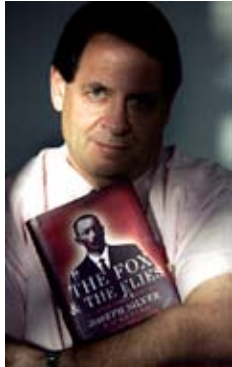




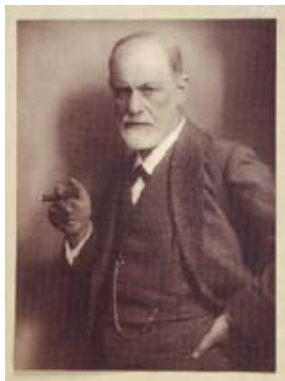

Sigmund Freud is arguably the most famous Jew of the 20th century, and yet his life as a Jew is deeply paradoxical.

Although his ideas and thinking are regarded as quintessentially Jewish, Freud referred to himself as 'a godless Jew'. And while he never denied his roots, he never actually participated in Jewish activities or ritual.

Kaplan's talk explores the paradox of Freud; his Jewish origins; his Jewish contemporaries; Jewish life in fin-de-siècle Vienna; empire and nationalism - the end of security; and finally psychoanalysis, the 'Jewish Science'.
